#### Obituary.



**JOLLI KING** 

Although Jolli will not have been known to many people in the breed today, in the 80s she was a prominent breeder, exhibitor and later, a judge. She was also an active and supportive member of the M&NCFBC.

Jolli died in Lincoln County Hospital on Saturday August 13th 2011, following a riding accident on August 4th. She was 55 years old. It is presumed she either fell from, or was thrown from her horse. She hacked most days, and was an accomplished rider.; hunting, and competing in dressage, cross country and show jumping, and this year had qualified for Badminton.

She came into Frenchies in the early 80s and had her first Frenchies Paling Pipistrelle at Pankington from Mrs & Mr Bowgen. In 1982 Pipistrelle was mated to Ch Hernhill Hugo and two from the resulting litter became champions. Ch Pankington Ariadne who was made up in 1984 and Ch Pankington Hadyn of Hernhill owned and campaigned by Mr & Mrs Elwyn Harding, took his title in 1986. Iolli bought a little brindle dog from Mr & Mrs Burrows, Auwil the Pedlar at Pankington, and he in turn did a lot of winning. He was also a very successful stud dog, siring amongst others, Ch Birique Bonzai Bull.

Pressure of work at her busy boarding kennels meant Jolli was able to show less and less, and, while she retained an interest in the breed, she stopped breeding and showing. She judged from time to time, and was our judge at Crufts in 2000.

She was a qualified Veterinary nurse—in the days when they were R.A.N.A.s, and she was often amused when her name appeared in show catalogues as Mrs J. King-Rana! She played the trumpet, worked hard for her local church and only gave up her boarding kennels 6 years ago. She was an active, vibrant and fun-loving person and to her husband, and children Dilly and Ben, our sympathy.

## IN MEMORY OF MR. A.W. HARKNESS.

Abe Harkness, of Lanarkshire, Scotland, sadly died very recently. Frenchies were a comparatively recent addition to his home, his first love being Staffordshire Bull Terriers. He bred Staffies, making up his first champion in 1959, Ch Wyecombe Jollie. Two more champions followed in 1960, Sahib of Senkrah and Wyecombe Melody of Senkrah, and he also bred Ch Senkrah Saphire who was made up in 1963. He judged the breed at the highest level, world wide. He was Secretary of the Scottish SBT club for several years and a Breed Council Delegate.

He bred and showed some very successful Frenchies too. Perhaps the best known was the brindle dog Stanley Drysdale's Ch. Ir Ch Senkrah Running Bear at Portmain, bred in partnership with Mrs Harkness, who was made up in 2000. He was, until very recently a member of our club. To his wife and daughter we extend our sympathy.

For the retired show dogs, and the loved pets who may or may not be an ideal candidate for the Veteran classes, but who would love to come to the show and receive the attention in the show ring which they deserve.

The show had drawn a record entry of 101 dogs for its fiftieth ch show, held at the governing body's purpose-built showground. The club had gone to a lot of trouble to ensure there was a very pleasant garden party atmosphere around the ring, enhanced by some gum trees which provided welcome shade as it was quite warm in the sun at times.

I was very pleased with the overall quality, feeling that the best dogs would compete well with the best in Britain. Anespecial highlight was the class of 16 baby puppy bitches – a real judging treat as so many of these twisting, turning bundles of delight appealed for different and various reasons. Choosing a winner was no easy task!

One thing I did notice was the fact that some of the dogs seemed slightly shorter on the legthan we are used to seeing in the UK. I made the point in my critique that this may be down to the influence of imports from North America and elsewhere. Certainly a point to ponder.

BIS went to ChFrogwyck Andromeda, a very typical and balanced bitch with a lovely head and super outline. Imagine my surprise to learn that the puppy I had given the Dog CC earlier in the day was her son, Frogwyck Drummer Boy, a stallion of a dog with good bone and a lovely large head. Their clever breeder and owner is Lyn Borg.

Drummer Boy and the RDCC winner, Embolden Rip Van Winkle(ex Andromeda's sister), another with quite a stallion look of quality, are both by a Maltese import, Der MickleoverHarumScarum. RBCC went to the ultra-feminine and shapely ChEmorette Maggie May who coped with the warm weather very well and never stopped showing. She comes from the same kennel as the winning baby puppy, Emorette Miss Eadee, who impressed me with her overall balance and quality.



There was a very pleasant get-together with wine and nibbles after the show. A fitting ending to a very enjoyable day spent with the friendly Australian Frenchie breeders and their lovely dogs.



## THE FRENCH BULLDOG CLUB OF AMERICA SPECIALTY, ALTANTA, GEORGIA

September 2011

Unless you have visited an American Specialty (Breed Club Championship Show) it is difficult to imagine the scale of things. Firstly, it lasts for 6 days, mornings, afternoons and evenings. Secondly, it takes place in an extremely large hotel. (The Hilton – limit 6 dogs permitted per room!) Thirdly there are upwards of 400 dogs. They are mostly Frenchies of course, but I saw several other breeds there as 'guests', staying for the week with their owners and handlers. Finally, you can do a Frenchie shop till you drop all day and every day!

Space will not allow me to go into great detail, so I will mention the things which struck me most:-

The number of veterinary surgeons who breed and show Frenchies! Take note KC and BSAVA! When it came to the Parade of Rescue Frenchies, the number of vets who had adopted a Rescue Frenchie after treating it while in its foster home – and the pride with which they paraded their pets!

The vociferous enthusiasm of the ringsiders – almost frightening at times, but a thoroughly sporting lot of exhibitors I must say.

The number of dogs present! The number of top quality dogs present! The lovely overall even size of the dogs present! The behaviour of the dogs present – not one cross word did I hear all week, and there were dogs everywhere – in the show halls, in the lifts, in reception, outside being exercised and, often,

crowded together in the ring. They were all delighted to see each other and anyone who stopped to speak to them. The temperament of all the Frenchies I met in America – a few hundred, could not have been bettered. Maybe we could learn from them – their breed standard states – 'Well behaved, adaptable, and comfortable companions with an affectionate nature and even disposition; generally active, alert, and playful, but not unduly boisterous'. I keep mentioning the 'well behaved' bit to my own clan – to Rosie as she kills and guts yet another cushion, and to them all as they take off across the fields after yet another rabbit – deaf to my pleas!

So, to my winners. Winners Dog went to Belboulecan Helceti's Cauis, a fabulous little brindle boy owned and shown by Lindsay Lynch in partnership with his breeder Dorit Fischler DVM. He is a cracking dog, no exaggerations, sound in every respect with a fabulous head, and correct body shape. Shown on a loose lead he did everything his owner asked of him and made the very best of himself. I learned later of the rather dream-come-true story behind this win. Lyndsay suffers from Lyme disease, and has been house bound and often bedridden for three years. During this time Capone has been her constant companion and beddog. Feeling better recently, she set her heart on taking him to the Specialty, and, despite surgery ten days before the show, Lindsay went to the Show, handled her dog herself. ....and came out on top of the 84 dogs entered!

The following day came the Winners Bitch classes, and here my winner was Robobull Gold Shield Justadream. Bred by James Dalton and Shelley St John who co-owns her with her handler Perry Payson, she is just that – a little dream of a brindle lady. Wonderful head and expression, super size, so well balanced, and again no exaggerations, sound as a pound, wonderful coat, well muscled and presented to perfection. A little star, with that special star quality, and, for me, she shone the brightest in the entry of 109 lovely bitches.

After the Winners classes comes the incredible Best of Breed Class - 112 of them! (66 dogs 46 bitches). Most of these were champions or grand champions – and the quality was almost unbelievable. Seeing so many fabulous Frenchies together is something I will never forget! It was almost impossible to decide between so many super dogs, but my choice fell once again to Justadream, and judging by the noise from the crowded ringside it was a popular choice. My Best Opposite Sex was another little brindle dog, GCh. Lebull's New Hope Wooly Bully, bred by Sylvia Campbell and owned by Ms Alexandra Geremia. Another fabulous little brindle dog, great substance for his size, so well constructed, balanced with, again no exaggerations, and a great head topped off with wonderful ear set.

I was allowed to award five Certificates of Merit – these went to Ch. Robobull Fabelhaft Amidreaming, GCh Foresta's Simply Victorious, Ch. Jackpot! I'm the Boss of Justus (a 10 year old Veteran), Belboulecans Helceti's Cauis and GCh. Maserati Grand Gyvybes Zyme. I would have liked to award at least another 30!



What a wonderful week. I met with old friends, and made new ones. I was treated with such kindness and consideration by the American Frenchie folk, and was overwhelmed by the in-depth quality of the American Frenchies, and, most especially by their impeccable temperaments.

# News Letter 🔓

Hello to all Frenchie Friends.

2011 Has been a year of ups and downs in the work of the Trust. At the beginning of the year we were very busy with the large numbers of dogs that came into the Trust over the previous two months; this was gradually dealt with through the hard work and dedication of Trustees, coordinators and members who pitched in to find suitable homes for what in some cases were very difficult dogs.

This was followed by our AGM in April where a number of topics and suggestions for the future direction of the Trust were discussed.

The year continued relatively quietly after that, on the administration front however more and more people were putting themselves forward to adopt a Frenchie, these had to be checked and happily members came forward to give up their time (and money) to do the checks in their area.

In recent weeks the numbers of dogs coming into the Trust are again rising with five being dealt with within a three week period we can only hope at the time of going to press that we do not have a repeat of last year.

A worrying trend that has been noted by the Trust is that many of the dogs now coming in appear to have temperament problems some of them serious, these arise either from the lack of socialisation or poor owner education allowing the dog to do as he or she pleases, with these problems in mind the Trustees are looking at ways that we can become involved in trying to educate the general public on the requirements for looking after and training our breed to be the loving loyal companions we know they can be.

We have begun some of this education on our website but hope to extend this either via puppy information packs for breeders to hand out to new owners, or for present owners who wish to avail themselves of this helpful information.

We would like anyone with ideas or experience in this type of promotion who wish to get involved

more with the Trust to contact us with their ideas. We also urge other interested organisations to get involved with this public education scheme, hopefully then the Frenchie buying Public will be able to start their life with frenchies with the knowledge of the breed and its requirements, leading to a more orderly dog friendly household, this will hopefuly gradually reduce the need for the Trust to deal with the problems later. The present advertising obsession with using Frenchies Is only refuelling the public's misconceptions of the breed leading eventually to disappointment and the abandonedment of dogs, when their own Frenchies don't do what they do on the adverts. We must try and balance this out with knowledge. Our network of knowledge is growing with more of our members volunteering to visit potential homes and making themselves available to the help anyone with advice and direction, we wish this to grow country wide.


