### <u>OBITUARY</u> BERIT SKATTKJAER

Berit was, at the time of her death, Norway's longest standing breederexhibitor. A friend to a lucky few in this country, she loved our clubs, our Frenchies and her visits to our shores. Her close friend Kari Bjornsen writes:

My best friend Berit Skattkjaer died 20th August 2010 at only 54 years old. It is not solely my loss; she will be missed and remembered by French Bulldog people and other dog lovers. She started in Frenchies in 1980, her prefix was Anbetris and she was active in the breed until the end. I bought my first Frenchie from her in 1985 and later she bought a few dogs from me. We worked closely together for the breed, and shared visits to shows and trips around the world.



Berit was a very active lady; full of energy, enjoying sports and long walks in the mountains and on the beaches with her Frenchies. She was never dull, always full of fun, radiating happiness and humour. She had such a warm personality, her home was always welcoming, and she cared deeply, not only for her dogs, family and friends, but also for all her puppy-buyers who remained friends for life.

She was a proud lady, honest, forthright, charmingly stubborn, completely loyal to her friends and constantly optimistic. Always in full control of her Frenchies and their well-being she was totally absent minded over minor things, like handbags, purses, car keys, ring numbers and which dog was entered in which class! This was a part of her charm and she was always surrounded by helpful, smiling friends. During her final illness and her great battle against cancer her first thoughts were for her children, grand-children and dogs. Everything was taken care of, and she was able to have her Frenchies with her almost to the end.

She leaves an enormous gap in our lives and she will always be missed.

Thank you Berit for being just the one you were.

I can only re-iterate what Kari has said. I first met Berit in 1984 when I judged the Swedish FB club show at Stockholm Int. and made her fabulous Int. Ch. Marikarlos Har Kommar Moa BIS. We became friends — as close as people living in different countries can be. All my memories of her are of a smiling lady, always full of fun, who had a deep knowledge of dogs and a lasting passion for our breed. It is so hard to imagine life without her.

MRS MABEL BURLEY

The French Bulldog world were all saddened to hear of the death in August of Mabel Burley, following a long illness.

Mabel was in the Auxiliary Territorial Service during World War 2, and served in Belgium and Germany. During this period, she met her husband Bill, who was in the Navy. After the war, they moved to a small village outside St Austell, Cornwall.

Mabel acquired her first French Bulldog, from the late Phyllis Bray, a pied bitch called Camelview Cathy who did a lot of winning in Obedience classes. Her first champion Frenchie was a beautiful brindle boy from the late Rosemary Young, Rhindog Hurricane Harry. Harry as he was known, was a little cracker, though a rascal, but Mabel just knew how to handle him. I'll always remember him, as when I was awarding tickets for the first time at Birmingham Championship show in 1988, he caught my eye as the most outstanding dog of the day. I awarded him his third CC that day, thus makinghimMabel'sfirstChampion.Fond memories of that day 22 years ago! Bill, her husband of many years was involved in Bloodhounds, though Mabel's interest was always Frenchies. She also awarded CC's in the breed for some considerable time, and it was enjoyable to have her judging our breed.

Mabel was a founder member of the

St Austell DCA, and then took on the role of Secretary for many years and latterly the President. She was also Secretary of the Royal Cornwall Agricultural Society, where she took this role very seriously. Mabel worked tirelessly on the 'dog scene', and her sense of duty to the people and their dogs was timeless.



A packed church of all her friends and family attended Mabel's funeral on August 20th. I was privileged to attend, and to represent both French Bulldog Clubs. Philip Stemp, also attended, in a personal capacity, and joined with us all in the service to celebrate her very diverse and happy life. Mabel's 'fuller than life' character will be sorely missed in the Frenchie world. Our thoughts go out to Bill and their son, at this sad time.

MPD (7,3) 1 Davis' Eastonite Diamond Geezer At Rowendale Seven month fawn lad who won the Class with to his nice easy sound movement. Good bone with nice front, good pasterns and neat feet. He had a compact body. Would have preferred a little more width to muzzle but young still 2 Akhursts' Tillcarr Didier Hotshot For Volens. Nice eight month brindle dog who Let himself down by becoming so easily distracted on the move. Preferred this lads head to winner 3 Greensmiths' Ageancourt Ebony Moon Over Nachadbe PD (2,2) 1 Banks' Nellbank Sindlers Rock Smart dog who had an excellent front, with absolutely sound pasterns. Would have preferred slightly more length to balance the picture, but he had a Nice rise over the loin. Moved soundly around the ring 2 Bryants' Risethor Tiger Tiger Another nice lad who had good width to his head and nice dark Round eye. Not as true in rear movement as winner but still a very nice youngster 3 Walthams' Grandesigns Checkmate Von Dringshaw

JD (8,2) 1 Haines' D'Accord Rene Lacoste (Imp Aust) A lovely puppy with short cobby body, would have preferred slightly more hind angulation and darker nails. Super shoulders, with good length and top line. Free easy mover 2 Worsleys' Son Of A Preacherman With Malpa. Good skull and foreface with nice ear Carriage. Slightly heavy over the shoulders. Body slightly longer than I prefer. He had excellent hindquarters. Super jacket and well handled. 3 Pipers' Pivotal Ebony Snow At Heidsieck Nice type pied dog who was well presented. Slightly heavy in front construction. Had good bone, neat feet and good overall balance. Nice easy profile movement YD (4,1) 1 Birks' Birique Yungun. Loved this youngster, such a lovely outline and in such gleaming jacket. Excellent head, eye and ear. Perhaps a tad wide in front, but otherwise a lovely balanced boy. Neat feet, and moved out well 2 Kennedy and Bootles' Tommyville Too Many Bagels. Another lovely young lad, he Excelled in his head plains and good ear carriage. Well balanced and bodied. Not quite so positive in rear as winner. 3 Pipers' Ageancourt Jimson Weed At Heidsieck Lots to like about this young lad, good neek set onto well muscled shoulders. Well bodied and covered the ground on the move.

ND (4,2) 1 Shorneys' Morvern Dominic. This lad won the class on his movement and more compact body. Nice head and eye and used ears well. Strong neck and body, rather straight behind. Had good profile movement. 2 Walthams' Grandesigns Checkmate Von Dringshaw. Dark bindle lad who had good front and hindquarters. Had more liberty through the loin than winner. In lovely jacket. PGD (2,1) 1 Mavro-Michaelis Shoebridge St Joseph Very dark brindle in super condition. Excelled in head and super neck and shoulders. Perhaps slightly short on the leg, however covered the ground well on the move.

MID LD (4,1a) I Welshs' Feniton Fineas Fogg Over Desrebtes. Impressive pied lad. Strong boy and not the easiest for his handler! Good overall shape and balance, good head and pigmentation. Lovely shoulders. Best mover in the class. 2 Howarths' Gizjo Mr Mcloud JW. Nice lad, with good overall balance. Nice head, dark eye and good ear carriage. Not so positive in rear movement. 3 Towners' Twinhoe Brian.

LD (4,1a) 1 Birks' Birique Yungun. 2 Cudbills' Musculus A Touch Of Frost. Strong brindle dog of pleasing type who was beautifully bodied. Expressive head and used ears well. He excelled in hind quarters. 3 Kennedys' Taxman Tommyville. Brindle lad who had a pleasing head, good ear shape and carriage and nice dark eye. Well laid shoulders, but a little straight behind.

OD (6,1a) Lovely class of dogs. 1 Drummonds' Sarabar Continental Affair At Glenlee. Lovely youngster who caught my eye as soon as he entered the ring. Just loved his head, super pigment and expression, he used his ears well. Balanced all through. Super front, excellent pasterns and neat feet. Nice rise over the loin which many were lacking. Moved well and positively, both fore and aft. Best Dog and Best of Breed. 2 Swaterbridges' Ch Birique Xentique JW. Judged this dog as a puppy and did him well then and he has gone onto mature into a lovely dog. Super head and pigment with lovely body. Today just preferred the winners front. Moved truly and positively. Reserve Best Dog. 3 Greensmiths' Gizjo Remisson With Nachadbe JW ShCM Quality strongly built pied dog who presented a lovely outline, with good top line. Well laid shoulders with nicely angulated hind quarters. Strong head with good muzzle.

VD (1) 1 Birks' Birique Prinzregent. 8 year old fawn dog of lovely type and balance. Lovely head, dark eye, and used ears well. Super straight front set well into lovely cobby body. Fit and moved out well.

SP OD PIED (3,1a) 1 Greensmiths' Ageancourt Ebony Moon Over Nachadbe. 2 Pipers' Pivotal Ebony Snow At Heidsieck. Sp OD Brindle (5) 1 Pipers' Ageancourt Jimson Weed At Heidsieck. 2 Kennedy And Bootles' Tommyville Too Many Bagels. 3 Towner's Twinhoe Brian

SP OD FAWN (3,1a) 1 Swaterbridges' Ch Birique Xentique JW. 2 Birks' Birique Prinzregent.

MPB (6) Some lovely puppies in this class although of varying type, 1 won on maturity. Both 1 & 2 moved with drive around the ring like seasoned campaigners! 1 Bootle and Harrison's' Tutu Much. Liked the overall type and conformation of this seven month brindle bitch. She was not making the most of herself, but could see enough Good width to head, expressive use of ears, nice neck set into good shoulders. Enough bone and strong pasterns. Nicely bodied with moderate expressive use of ears, nice neck set into good shoulders. Enough bone and strong pasterns. Nicely bodied with moderate hind angulation. Best Bitch Puppy and BPIS. 2 Smalls' Shoebridge Lavilledieu At Merimna. A different type, but very nice 7 month puppy. Good outline with good rise over loin. Strong black nails and in excellent jacket. Sympathetically handled. 3 Evans' Tillcarr Eleonore.

PB (8,1a) Nice class of puppies who I am sure will all do well. 1 Kendricks and Jones' Acirema Lady Dipsey Eleven month puppy who is developing well, good bone and body. Expressive head with dark eye and used ears well. Super little mover, especially her profile gait. 2 Drummonds' Glenlee Spirit Dancer Another exciting bitch with everything in the right place. Preferred her hindquarters to winner and has good strong pasterns. 3 Keates' Nokomis Prairie Flower. Although slightly longer in length this is a pretty bitch who excels in hjer front assembly and true positive movement.

JB (7,2a) 1 Ashs' Crindles Hot Gossip At Fabelhaft Nice youngster who was handled to advantage. Lovely head with good width. Excellent shoulders, nice cobby body and correct top line. Moved with drive around the ring. 2 Dallisons' Chelmbull Cover Girl. Another nice brindle bitch who excelled in head expression and body. Pasterns slightly weak but moved well around the ring. 3 Blanks Westmount Lawless Lucy.

YB (5,3a) 1 Quinns' Nirojo Imperial Rose JW. Pleasing well balanced youngster with good bone and feet. Expressive head and good ear carriage. Nice front which allowed her to stride out nicely. Lovely jacket. 2 Longdons' Alsuma Morning Shadow. Pleasing type of bitch who was stronger in build than the winner. Good overall outline and moved out well. NB (2,1a) 1 Dallisons' Chelmbull Cover Girl.

GB (1) 1 Sandersons' Conysluck Tracy At Wherewithall. Outgoing fawn bitch with good head, dark pigment & excellent ear carriage. Super neck. Well bodied. Good side gait and moved freely around the ring.

PGB (6,3a) 1 Dealaselles' Rossbails Sugar Butty. Nice type of bitch, not exaggerated in any way. Nice head, good front and cobby body. Bit reticent on the move, looked as though she would have rather been at home! 2 Mavro-Michaelis' Shoebridge Vouvray. Fawn bitch with good mask. Didn't quite have the width of muzzle as winner. Good overall outline. Would have preferred slightly stronger pasterns. 3 Sandersons' Conysluck Tracy At Wherewithall.

Mid LB (4,2a) 1 Birques Birique Winnerova. Personally would have preferred a little more length in body and neck, however she excelled in head, ear shape and carriage and super strong pasterns and free movement which won her the class. 2 Fishers' Grandesign's Centrefold. Darkest of brindles with super balance. Preferred her overall length to winner. Expressive head, although would have preferred slightly more width to muzzle. Showed and moved well.

LB (4,2a) 1 Kendrick and Jones' Acirema Lady Gemma. Good honest bitch with good head, dark eye and ear shape and carriage. Lovely shoulders which were balanced with her good rear quarters. This bitch was a real showgirl whose handler kept her attention on the move to show her to advantage. 2 Birks' Birique Zcepshional. Good type of bitch, who had a really super head and pigment. Good body with correct rise over the loin. Not so happy on the move today.

OB (3,1a) 1 Wildmans' Ch Wildax Miss Moneypenny. Lovely outgoing bitch in splendid hard condition presenting an attractive overall outline. She excels in her front assembly, with very good hind quarters and angulation. Would prefer slightly more rise to loin. Nice expressive head with good ear shape and carriage. Handled very well to show off her good movement. Best Bitch and RBIS. 2 Stansfields' Nokomis Whispering Breeze ShCM. Although quite different to winner, lots to like. She had a good strong neck, good body and correct topline. Would have preferred a stronger pastern to complete the picture.

VB (6,2a) This was a lovely class to judge and they were all a credit to their owners. 1 Birks Ch Birique Prinzessen JW. Nearly 8 years old. Loved this bitches overall balance and type. She excels in front and rear quarters, with super hind angulation, which many were lacking. Still retains her super dark mask which accentuates her lovely head. Sadly was not so keen in moving with any oomph today but this lady is a beautiful bitch. Best Veteran In show. 2 Keates' Ch Nokomis Clear 'N' Sunny Waters JW ShCM. 8 years old. Different in type to winner being a little longer cast to winner. She was very fit and excelled in her shoulders and top line. Well handled. 3 Harrisons' Tommyville Thora Thorndyke. 9 year old Fawn lady with good dark mask. Slightly heavier in type than I prefer but still a sound typical frenchie who was enjoying her day out. Sp Open Pied (1) Longdon;s Alsuma Morning Shadow

### Arnies story



Arnie was five weeks old when he was taken to the vets by his breeder to be put to sleep. The vet refused to euthanize a healthy puppy and the French Bulldog Welfare Trust was contacted. I travelled to Bridgend in Wales with a friend to collect him and bring him home.

When we got there he was sitting very quietly in his cage in the vets.

I expected a shy timid little puppy, frightened of his surroundings, what I got was a lovable bouncy beast.

The minute I held him in my arms I fell in love with him, he had his own carrier and came with a little teddy bear to cuddle up to. The minute I cuddled him in the car and as much as I tried not to, I fell in love with him. On the way home we stopped for a toilet break, we found a bi of grass and put him down. I expected him to just sit down and not want to move. No not Arnie! He found a bee to sniff and tried to eat it. Finally home and settled him in, he had a rough time to begin with, sneezing and a runny nose and other minor issues which kept him on a long course of antibiotics. He settled in well and my other dogs and the cats accepted him into the family. He initially bumped into things and had typical puppy accidents in the house. Now he rarely bumps into things and has outgrown the accidents. He can get himself up and down from the sofa and out into the garden when he needs to go to the toilet. Outside he runs around like a lunatic chasing Theo my other Frenchie or one of the cats. He is hilarious. The other day he was out in the garden and I couldn't see him. I shouted for him to come in and he appeared from behind a tree with a wood pigeon in his mouth. You could see he was well pleased with his little self. I was not.

I had only expected Arnie to be with me a couple of months and I was happy to prepare him to go to his new life with a loving family, but the longer he stayed the harder it was getting to convince myself that it was best for him to go to a new family. In the end I couldn't let him go.

The fact is Arnie is totally blind. I know that, you know that, but Arnie doesn't. He is a happy bouncy confident loud and totally wonderful little dog. He has no idea he is different, and, except for his blindness he isn't.

### The French Bulldog Welfare Trust **Registered Charity No.287420.**



Ten years ago the French Bulldog as a breed was still quite a rare sight in Britain's streets and homes. There were a number of reasons for this; firstly the small numbers of Frenchies being bred and registered at the time, usually by dedicated breed enthusiasts who were very careful about breeding and placed their puppies with like minded people. Secondly, the almost none existence of imported Frenchies, due to quarantine, and finally, but most importantly, because the breed managed to stay beneath the radar of most of the UK puppy farmers.

However, even during this time, the French Bulldog Welfare Trust which had been created some fifteen years earlier by a small number of volunteers still had to quietly deal with unwanted or poorly treated Frenchies from around the UK. Unfortunately the anonymity of the breed in the UK has been eroded in recent years due to their use in TV adverts and programs, and association with celebrity life styles and fashion items. Like many other breeds who have been the 'flavour of the month' (Boxers, Dalmatians, Labradors), it has created a sudden interest and a market not only within the general public but also for the puppy farmers. The number of Frenchies registered with the Kennel Club in the last few years has almost trebled. Imports have also risen due in some cases thanks to the introduction of the pet passport scheme. Some of these imported Frenchies come from countries which do not have the breed health and welfare systems in place that we have in the UK. Though some try their best to only import from tested bloodlines and reputable breeders, puppy farmers and their like care very little for the medical problems their imported dogs may bring with them. This situation can and has only placed more Frenchies in need of the services provided by the Welfare Trust. Therefore it was decided by the Trustees that it was time the Welfare Trust became more proactive and visual. We have begun to do this by creating our own Website, an annual news letter will also soon be available, and we are also actively recruiting more volunteers around the country to provide a broader network of knowledgeable people to help with the services we offer. A recent example of the Welfare Trust new system was the rescue of a very young dog puppy called Arnie whose story you can read elsewhere in this publication. He came to us following a phone call from a sympathetic Vet who was not prepared to put Arnie to sleep. The vet had recently heard about the Welfare from a local animal Shelter we had been involved with earlier, and, as a result, Arnie was handed over to the Trust. He was picked up and transported by Trust volunteers over one hundred and fifty miles where he received the care and special attention he needed and finally a loving, safe forever home. The Welfare Trust continues to need more volunteers in various parts of the UK to expand our network. We need help with transport, home visits, assisting Frenchie owners in need of short term help, picking up Frenchies coming into Welfare, fostering, whether long or short term, liasing with local animal shelters who may take in Frenchies, or helping to promote the name and the work of the Trust within their local area.

Whilst the 'flavour' bubble will eventually burst, it is the French Bulldog Welfare Trust and its volunteers that will continue to deal with the fallout. Why not get in touch and find out more about how you can help. *Miek Gerden*



### Norway Trip

I was absolutely thrilled when I was invited to accompany Maureen Bootle (Tommyville) and Wendy Henderson (Bumbledor) to Norway for 4 days. As I have only had the breed for 5 years I saw it was a great opportunity to learn and experience more about the breed and in such great company, so I accepted.

We were to stay with fellow breed enthusiast and talented breeder Kari Bjornsen (Babybull) at her home in Norway and we were to attend 2 shows. The first, on the Saturday, was an all breed general championship show and the second, on the Sunday was the Breed Club's Autumn championship show.

We set off on the Friday and were greeted by Kari at the airport. She had planned a packed weekend of Frenchies, food and great company, and we wasted no time that evening in going to see a litter of lovely brindle puppies at a nearby breeder's home.

Early on Saturday morning we travelled to Rogaland International Championship show where Finnish judge Harry Tast officiated. From the ringside one of the first things I noticed was how the Frenchies there are very much family dogs before show dogs, no benches and hardly any in crates and cages; simply just sitting on their owners laps and they were absolutely thrilled to see other Frenchies. It was as if they recognised each other and it was a reunion from the last show they attended.

The judging there is a lot different to ours. I did wonder why some dogs were coming out of the ring just after being assessed and the owners had a blue ribbon in their hands. This meant that the judge has sort of dismissed them from the ring. The judge would explain in his written critique which every dog receives, his reasons for this, e.g. some we heard were excused for having light eyes. This meant that the judge wasn't going to consider them for a higher award, so off they went. I wonder what our judges would make of that or better still what would the exhibitors make of it? It seemed at that show a lot of dogs were excused, and the owners accepted it gracefully and came out with a smile

Best of Breed was a lovely pied bitch, really showy, named Zecudas French Temptress. She was the Swedish Junior World Winner 2010 owned by Elizebeth Olsen and Bjorn Leken. Res Best Of Breed was Temptress' litter brother, another pied, was Zecudas Forever N Ever, breeder-owner Meredethe Gjesiera.

The evening after the show, Kari, our hostess, was having her usual informal dinner party for Frenchie enthusiasts, which she holds every year for this special week-end. This was her 25th such gathering. Some guests were newcomers to the breed. She had also organised a raffle for which the guests and Kari had kindly brought prizes.

These prizes were very much sought after by us all ... Unfortunately luck wasn't with the English, but it was in a way, as all the money raised by the raffle was donated to our very own French Bulldog Welfare and it totalled £200 - an amazing achievement. Bas Bosch had some really lovely dogs to go over. I was to compete in Champion Class with Int. Nor. Fin. UCh Nord.V-05 Babybull's Mandy, a gorgeous fawn, just coming up to her 7th birthday. There were 8 champion bitches in the class and we came 2nd behind Kari's other fawn bitch N UCh NV-08-09 Babybull's Ulla. Along with our blue ribbon for 2nd place we also received a pink ribbon meaning that I was to go back into the Best Bitch challenge even though I had been beaten. Bas Bosch thought her quality sufficient to be graded 'excellent' so she was able to be considered for Res Best bitch.

We, the Babybull's, competed for Best Breeder along with 3 other teams - Joy Of, Go-Luna & Zecudas and we were delighted to win the best Breeder Group award. The judge made a highly complimentary speech to the ringside about the quality of the Breeder Group competition, saying they would stand out in any company anywhere in the world. It was an honour and privilege to handle Mandy and we did her owner/breeder proud.

Monday we were returning home, but not before a lovely lunch and a spot of shopping in Kari's hometown, Stavanger. One of us bought a very large solid silver sitting Frenchie pendant!

I had a fabulous break away from the hustle and bustle of family life, and a relaxing time with Frenchies, Dog Shows and excellent company.





Thank you to all those who voted for me to judge this show; I was honoured to have so many lovely dogs to go over. My decisions were accepted in a very sporting manner by exhibitors and spectators alike. The girls outshone the males, and I could have happily awarded CCs to 10 deserving bitches. I have recently bemoaned lack of muscle in many exhibits; this was not so today. Overall quality was very good, soundness prevailed and most of the exhibits were in good, hard condition. On the down side too many exhibits had spread feet and long nails. A few were noticeably slab-sided, lacking any spring of rib, and one had a level bite. I had two hard working and efficient stewards and my thanks to them. The lighting in the hall made eye colour a little difficult to assess.

MPD. 4 (0). 1. Tilley's Mossport Michelangelo. The oldest and certainly the most mature in the class. Sound brindle boy with promising head properties, especially good ears, his eye could be darker. He is balanced but I hope he doesn't get any bigger. 2. Girling's Ageancourt New Moon. Just over 6 months and still very much a baby. Super bone and substance for his size, so well balanced, cobby and moved with aplomb. Oozing promise. 3. Worsley's Ageancourt Eclipse over Malpa. Well marked pied, litter brother to 2. Also very shapely with enough roach, still a little loose on the move, straight front and tight feet. His head needs time. Three promising babies.

PD 2 (0) 1. Sygrove's Robeta's Storming Wind. Beautifully balanced solid brindle boy. Enough bone, good front, compact feet and short nails. Correct top line, good rib cage, and muscular. Promising head. He moved well and was well presented. To be hypercritical I would like a less harsh coat. BPD 2. King & Bates Brandoux's Theoux. A larger puppy. Lovely ears, broad skull with plenty of work in his head giving a lovely expression. He did not like moving today.

JD 10 (1) A very good class overall. Krall's Jafrak Pistols at Dorn. A cracking muscular fawn dog, balanced, sound with a super head, lovely shaped eye, well set on and well carried ears, which he used to great advantage. Broad wrinkled skull, good fill under the eye, open nostrils and a wide muzzle with good sweep of under jaw giving a great square head set off by the darkest of masks. Arched neck. Good bone for his size, lovely deep wide front – plenty of heart room. Enough hind angulation. Lovely smooth coat. Sound as a pound, and put down to perfection. I would like a slightly less pronounced roach but the rest of him is oh, so good. CC and BOS and res BIS. 2. Keates' Nokomis Lone Wolf. This was The Dog the Judge Would Most Like to Take Home! My notes say – What a Joy! A lesson in Frenchie character, truly clown-like and vivacious. He is a cobby compact brindle Frenchie, with super bone and substance. Good wide front, and so sound on the move. Lovely square head and expression. Not so mature as my winner. This little dog thoroughly enjoyed his day, and the spectators loved his antics. 3. Birks Birique Zylabull. Another very promising youngster with a super square head, well set ears and Bible black eyes. Correct top line, bone and substance. Very sound and an excellent little showman. Lovely coat texture and in great condition. Not yet as mature in body as those above.

- YD. 2 (0) 1. Worsley's Son of a Preacherman with Malpa. A dark brindle boy with good bone, nicely roached back and correct tail. A wide skull, slightly nosey at this stage. He moved well and was well presented. Feet could be tighter and nails darker. 2. Eskrett's Grandesign's Pole Position. A lovely coloured brindle, good neck and head but would like a darker eye. A shade long cast but correct roach and very sound mover.
- ND 2 (0) 1. Birk's Harrowhill Sovereign Birique A really super young dog, very light brindle. A grand head, square, with a deep wide underjaw, well filled muzzle and super ears. Strong arched neck and a shapely cobby body. Super bone and substance. Super straight front, tight feet, deep, wide chest. Good topline. He is small but so masculine. Great on the move and a very promising young showman. 2. Waltham's Grandesign Checkmate von Dringshaw. A brindle boy with a very good head and expression. Good neck, a little rangey in body. Very sound on the move.
- GD 5 (2) Three quality Frenchies. 1. Bryant's Risethor Tiger Tiger. Wonderful breed type. Ideal size, correct brindle colour, lovely bone and such a compact, cobby little chap. Super head, wide skull, classic ears, round, eye, wide muzzle and a typical Frenchie expression. Strong neck. He is still young and will mature a little more yet. A cracking Frenchman. 2. Eskrett's Ranacani Riddick Stower. A very balanced, sound fawn boy, up to size, but has a great head. He showed very well, and is full of enthusiasm taking a great interest in the proceedings. A little more spring of rib would improve the overall picture. 3. Pipers Ageancourt Jimson Weed at Heidsieck. A light brindle boy, ideal size and a lovely head. Fabulous Frenchie expression. Wide skull, well filled foreface, wide muzzle, good nose and lovely bat ears. Good substance and bone. Feet could be tighter, and his movement was a little erratic today.
- PGD 4 (1). 1. Smith's Obarna's Mettvadders Merlin (Swe. Imp.) A well balanced brindle dog, full of quality, and very good on the move. Enthusiastic, attentive showman who has all the essentials. Very good head with width all through and topped off with good ears. Excellent size and shape of eye giving a good expression. Good feet. Well up to size and perhaps a shade overweight. 2. Howarth's Gizyjo Mr McCloud. JW. One I have always admired from the ringside, and I preferred his size to 1, but today in he was in non-co-operation mode and simply would not make the best of himself. A lovely size and type, super brindle colour, and a very shapely body. He moved to perfection. He had a masculine head but sadly was not using his ears. Really good type. 3. Dealaselle's Kenocto Bundle of Fun. A very good headed fawn, with a dark mask. Fun loving personality and moved very well. I would like more weight over his loins and a fraction more spring of rib. Big enough.
- MLD 1 (0). 1. Welsh' Feniton Fineas Fogg over Desrebtes. A striking, handsome hooded pied with a clear coat. Well muscled, full of life and presented on top form. Shapely body with good front and quarters, moved well. Wide skull, well shaped well carried ears, but I would like more cushioning under the eye and a bit more width of muzzle.
- LD 8 (3) 1. Greensmith's Gizyjo Remisson with Nachadbe. Another striking hooded pied, put down to perfection. Ideal size, very typey and balanced overall. Enough bone and good straight front, and moved beautifully on a loose lead. In the final line up I felt he needed more substance overall. 2. Birks Birique Yungun. A super brindle boy, balanced, really sturdy and ideal movement. Heavier in bone and more substance than 1, but really not co-operating with his owner and looking unhappy. Splendid head properties, wide skull, plenty of fill under the eyes, and good wide nostrils and a broad muzzle Sufficient hind angulation and wide deep chest and straight front. Great ribs, deep wide chest. Classic tail. 3. Gordon's Rustibee Maximus, another super Frenchie who refused to co-operate but his quality cannot be denied. Ideal size and type, lovely smooth, shiny brindle coat. Really shapely, muscular, compact body with enough roach, spring of rib and cut-up. Lovely head properties but his nose was glued to the floor most of the time.
- OD 1 (0) 1. Smith's Ch. Sarabar Spirit in the Mist. A full-of-himself fawn with a black mask. Really well muscled, good bone and so sound on the move another who moved freely and well on a loose lead. Straight front, good hindquarters, and a lovely head, splendid in profile. I liked him so much, but felt he could have carried a bit more weight over the loins today. Res CC.
- VD~2~(1)~Birk's Birique Prinzregent ~8~year~old~fawn~boy,~in~tip~top~condition,~muscular,~very~shapely~body. He did not look or behave like a Veteran. Moved beautifully. He has a super masculine head and expression and shows to perfection. <math>BVD

Sp, OBr.D 2 (0). 1. Smith's Ch. Ageancourt Foxglove. Lovely brindle colour, sturdy balanced dog with a straight strong front, shapely body and a pleasing head. Moved and showed like the champion he is, but feeling the heat a little and perhaps not quite so sprightly as he used to be. However, a really typey Frenchie. 2. Wood's Zon Mirekl Stanley at Delightbull naf (Imp Rus). A little brindle fellow with a lovely head. He is not at all enthusiastic about this showing lark but has all the essentials. I would like more substance.

MPB 8 (2) My first three were all just 6 months old. 1. Cook's Nkunde Carry On Well balanced brindle girl, who is very shapely with a lovely topline. She has a very promising feminine head with a divine expression. She has a smooth coat, moved and showed well, but I don't want her any higher on the leg. 2. Ollier's Ageancourt Midnight Sun. Not so mature as 1, but a lovely compact shapely baby. Plenty of substance for her size, just enough bone, Wide skull and promising foreface. Could be tighter on the move, but she is very young. 3. Hatchman & Swifts Convica Russian Doll. Another with a shapely compact cobby body, good bone and promising head. A lovely puppy who hated every minute of her time in the ring.

PB 4 (0). 1. Chamber's Glenlee Indian Spirit at Luvum. A cracking puppy. Super fawn colour with the blackest mask. She has a square head with a broad wrinkled skull, correct nostrils, round eye, lovely sweep of underjaw, the whole topped off with well carried ears. Good bone, sturdy body with lovely rib cage, and wide chest, but please don't let her get any fatter. BP. 2. Hines & Ashards Bredwardine Rydyah Well balanced brindle girl with a really promising typical feminine head. Structurally sound, shapely and typical movement. Just enough bone. 3. Embley's Glenlee Sacred Spirit. Feminine fawn baby, lovely size, compact shapely body, great bone, and one of those super heads expected from this kennel. Would like tighter front and feet, but overall a lovely puppy.

JB 6 (1) 1. Beale's Kargrays Diamond Dazzler A very shapely light brindle, mature for her age. Good topline, deep wide front, good rib cage – plenty of heart room. Enough bone. Sound mover. I would have preferred darker eyes and nails, but overall a lovely young Frenchie. 2 Howarth's Gizyjo Miss Fredrique. All the dogs I saw from this kennel moved exceptionally well. This bitch was a joy to watch as she stepped out – no stringing up here. Very shapely body with strong muscular quarters. She could fill a little more in foreface, but her head is otherwise very good, and she uses her well shaped ears to advantage. She has a super, smooth, almost mahogany brindle coat. 3. Keates' Nokomis Prairie Flower. Another balanced brindle girl, a super mover. She shows off her lovely head properties so well, has a lovely arched neck and great front. I would like a little more substance. She has a lovely topline and the finishing touch is a classic tail.

YB. 5 (2) 1. Hammond's Living Next Door to Alice. Half sister to the comedy turn in Junior Dog, and a real comedienne! She is spirited, affectionate and full of fun. She is also one of the best muscled Frenchies I saw all day, so sound, and an ideal size. She has a lovely head, square but feminine and the most alert, engaging expression and super ears. I wish she had just a little more substance, but she is a cracking little dog overall. 2. Forster's Zon Mirekl Nikita at Kaiserstaffs. A pied with a lovely clear coat and black eye rims, dark eyes and lovely eye shape. She has a broad skull with well set ears on top. Good overall substance, great rib cage, and very sound on the move. Showed well. Would like tighter feet. 3. William's Dalspa Devine Miss Emm.

Another well marked pied, half hooded. Black eyes. Would like more width of foreface, splendid ears. Well balanced overall, muscular, straight front and quarters, and a wide brisket. Shows herself to advantage.

NB 3. 1. Fisher's Grandesign Photogenic. Ideal size and type. Shapely body with wide rib cage, cut up and neat roach. Good front and strong quarters. A lovely head, good layback, well filled foreface, correct nostrils and an appealing feminine expression. Very sound on the move and well presented. 2. Z.M. Nikita at K. 3. Swateridge Skybull Marie Antoinette Xentique. Beautifully presented, well marked hooded pied with a good front, bone and feet. A little straight in stifle and up to size. Good head, with really super ears which she uses. Sound movement.

GB 2. (1) 1. Evan's Tillcarr Eleanore A shapely brindle girl with a pretty feminine head, lovely round eye and good lay-back. Deep, wide chest and well shaped ribs. Very showy lady but a bit erratic on the move.

PGB 10 (3) 1. Souter's Greusaiche Daydreamer A smart dark brindle lady with a really splendid head, good width throughout, a lovely full round eye, and ears which she used well. In excellent condition overall, lovely front and quarters, sympathetically handled and sound movement. 2. Dealaselle's Rossballs Sugar Butty

A light brindle shapely bitch with sufficient bone, straight wide front, good head qualities, especially good in foreface. In hard condition. Rather a reluctant show girl.

3. K .Diamond Dazzler

MLB 5 (2) Chapman & Conways Norcairn Dark Angel JW ShCM. A lovely quality youngster; her head is so well finished. Wide skull with super shaped ears which she uses well, plenty of fill in her foreface, good lay back and a super profile. Strong neck, and well proportioned body with a lovely roach, cut up and good quarters. Her front is straight and her pasterns sound with good feet. She makes the best of herself in the ring, personifying health and vitality. In a fantastic line up of bitches in the challenge her type, balance and I Rule The World attitude could not be beaten. CC and BIS. I believe this makes her a champion. Well done. 2. Howarths Gizyjo Palamino A very shapely balanced fawn lady. A lesson in correct movement. Good bone, substance. Lovely feminine head properties. A very typey Frenchie with a delightful temperament. 3. Souter's Madainn Highland Miss Chief. A young veteran fawn who is very sound. A lovely head set off by great ears and a black mask. Well put together and moved soundly.

LB 10 (2). To look at the bitches in this class was Heaven, to have to place them was the opposite. Many glib remarks are made in critiques about good dogs going cardless but in this class alone I could have awarded 7 CCs, and that meant 2 cracking bitches left the ring and others were placed down the line. Possibly the best class of bitches I have ever seen. 1. Kendrick & Jones Acirema Lady Gemma. Excels for type and soundness and has wonderful bone. Lovely mover on a loose lead. Her head is so feminine with a wide skull, lovely eye shape and well filled fore face, and good lay back. She has lovely ears but she has to be persuaded to use them, and can lack sparkle. However overall she is a lovely quality Frenchie. Gave up completely in the challenge. 2. Smith's Sarabar Fantasy Dreamer A really beautiful fawn bitch, well made and balanced. Typical Frenchie head and expression. Compact shapely body with ideal bone and substance. Moved with a lovely Frenchie swagger, showed and presented to perfection. Not quite the hind angulation of 1. 3. Birks' Birique Xceptional. This lovely fawn girl was the most muscular in the class and is in wonderful hard condition. She personifies compact and cobby, and has a wonderful deep wide chest, and fantastic rib cage. Lovely bone, straight front and good feet. Her head is classic. Today she was not making the best of herself, I have seen her show so much better. I repeat, all these girls and four others in this class are deserving of their titles.

OB 3 (2) 1. Stood alone but a worthy winner. Wildman's Ch. Wildax Miss Moneypenny. Brindle girl in good hard condition. Enough bone and a wide front and tight feet. Lovely ribs and good strong powerful neck. Excellent ears and eyes and good deep underjaw. Makes the very best of herself at all times in the ring, and does all her handler asks of her. I preferred the topline of my CC winner.

VB 6 (2). All four were so fit and sound, in tip top condition - their ages ranging from 7 to almost 10 years. 1. Birks' Ch Birique Prinzessen. At 8 years old she remains a model for the breed, and is the type we should be aiming for. She is the correct size, has really good bone, straight front, tight feet, short black nails, and sound pasterns. Lovely deep wide chest, shapely ribs, narrowing just enough over strong loins and well angulated hind quarters. Her topline is classic and she has a good cut up and just enough tail. Her head leaves nothing to be desired and she is at one with her handler, watching his every move. Res CC 2. Keates' Ch Nokomis Clear n Sunny Water JW ShCM. Another star who still shines very brightly. Sound, balanced, a lovely head and very shapely body in super condition. Shows non-stop and does it all on a loose lead. 3. Souter's Madainn Highland Miss Chief.

Sp.OPB 2 (0) 1. V.M. Nikita at K. 2. Sakazoke Bebe Dior A well marked pied girl, who moved soundly and has good coat condition. She still has a lot of maturing to do and is rather rangey at this stage.

Sp.OFB 2. (1) 1. Souter's Madainn Highland Miss Chief

Sp.OBB. 7 (1) 1. Birks' Birique Treacle Puddin. Another 'lady of a certain age' who is in top form moving round the ring with tremendous style and presence. Lovely short, shapely cobby body, strong wide front, fantastic rib cage, and the most beautiful head with round coal black eyes, lovely width of muzzle, super underjaw and a melting expression. Good muscle tone and sound on the move. Scored on animation over 2. G.Daydreamer. 3. R. Suger Baby.
